**The Sacrament of Baptism (3)** The responsibilities of parents in regard to their children in baptism are spelled out to them unequivocally by the priest or deacon during the Rite of Baptism itself, so that there can be no chance of their misunderstanding what they are doing:

"You have asked to have your child baptized. You are choosing to bring him / her up in the ways of faith, loving and serving Our Lord Jesus Christ in the community of the Church. And so I ask you, do you clearly understand the responsibility you are undertaking?"

"Make the lives of his / her parents and godparents examples of faith to inspire him / her."

"On your part, you must make it your constant care to bring him / her up in the practice of the faith. See that the divine life that God gives him / her may grow always stronger in his / her heart."

"See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven"

"Receive the light of Christ. Parents and godparents this light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly.

This child of yours had been enlightened by Christ. He / she is to walk always as a child of the light."

The life of discipleship of Jesus begins with this beautiful sacrament and is lived out every day in prayer and action within one's own family and the family of the Church. To do any other is to deny the baptism our children have received, even, it could be argued, to nullify it. We simply cannot bring a child into the Christian community one day and then remove them from it until the time of their First Communion. Parents are the key people here. It is they who will teach their children to pray, to speak the name of God, to feel his promptings in their hearts and to show them how to respond to those promptings generously and selflessly in the life of service of Our Lord who himself, gave his own life-away for us all. Sadly, this is not always the case and does not happen in the way that it should, and it would appear that many parents now are content to sit lightly to the promises they have made without taking these very serious commitments responsibly. Accordingly, we have decided to change the manner in which baptisms are now prepared for and celebrated in our parishes, so that this sad situation will not persist. *(To be continued)*
