### "How can I ever thank you?" (1)

On September 6-8 this year Liverpool will host the first Eucharistic Congress to take place in this country for many years. Several people from our communities will be representing us at "Adoremus", and Bishop Patrick has encouraged us all to prepare prayerfully for this event. This is what we have been quietly doing since Holy Week, First Communion and we have also spent much time this summer at our House Masses in considering what it means to thank God for his goodness to us, which he has shown to us in Jesus his Son – "How can I ever thank you?" The word, "Eucharist" means 'thank you', and we come to pray the Mass together each week to thank Our Lord for all he has done to us by doing the very thing he has asked his followers to "Do this in memory of me". Not only do we respond to this request in sharing the prayer of the Mass, but we also become conscious that we belong to something bigger than ourselves and find the Lord in the members of our communities as well. He is there to guide and comfort us and to invite us to do the very same for others in his name. But it would appear that many people, especially the parents of our little children, do not fully appreciate this when they bring their children for baptism, as we have mentioned here in the past few weeks. Somehow we have not fully understood what we are doing, hence the need to meditate on it a little more carefully and thoughtfully during these summer weeks. "Going to church" is not like going to the cinema or some sporting event. We do not do it for our entertainment or because it makes us "feel good". We do it because Our Lord has asked us to, because we want to love and honour him as the one true God of our lives, to seek his help to live joyfully and generously in his service and to show us how to bring his gospel message to others by our way of living. This is why it is essential to make this practice a regular part of our lives and prayer – because we have perceived the need to say 'thank you', not because we want something for ourselves. *(To be continued)*
