War Dead to be remembered at Christmas event - November 11 is always a special day in the year - Armistice Day - when, as a nation, we take time to remember all those who gave their lives in war. A key element in this is the two minutes' silence we observe that day at 11.00am. It is so moving to see the country literally grind to a halt for those two minutes, to ensure their sacrifice is not forgotten. For this reason, at the AlterNativity event, which is taking place that day in the United Reformed Church in The Borough from 10.00am to 2.00pm and at which the Mayor, the chief citizen of the borough will be present, the proceedings will be halted at precisely 11.00am for us all to take time to remember. We also take time to remember our families, friends, loved ones along with people in need all over the world at Christmas, which is the purpose of AlterNativity, a scheme now in its 12th year here, that encourages us to give gifts that really matter to the people who really need them. 21 local and international charities will benefit from this year's project.
